

Bunny C. Clark

unny C. Clark joined The Ohio State University's faculty in the Department of Physics in 1981 and became a full professor in 1986. She was named Distinguished University Professor, Ohio State's highest honor for a faculty member, in 1989. Professor Clark earned a bachelor of science degree with honors in physics and mathematics in 1958 and a master's degree in physics in 1963 from Kansas State University. In 1973, she received a doctorate in theoretical physics from Wayne State University.

Highly regarded in the scientific community, Professor Clark is considered a pioneer in the field of theoretical physics, especially in the relativistic treatment of nuclear reactions. She has published more than 80 scholarly articles and presented more than 150 lectures on her research, which has had a major impact on theoretical physics. National recognition for her research

expertise has included selection as an American Physical Society Fellow in 1984 and an American Association for the Advancement of Science Fellow in 1996. In 1999, she received the Fowler Award for Excellence in Nuclear Physics from the Ohio Section of the American Physical Society.

At Ohio State, Professor Clark was instrumental in developing the World of Energy physics course, a discoverybased, hands-on course for non-science majors, taken by some 300 students a quarter. Her service at the university has been wide-ranging. She has been a member of several search committees, the Provost and President's Advisory Committee, the University Senate, and the board of directors of The Ohio State University Research Foundation. She is a recipient of the Faculty Award for Distinguished University Service, the University Distinguished Research Award, the Rosalene Sedgwick Faculty

Service Award, and the University Distinguished Affirmative Action Award. In addition, she was chosen as one of the YWCA Women of Achievement in 1993 and was elected to the Ohio Woman's Hall of Fame in 1994.

Professor Clark is past-chair of the American Physical Society (APS) Division of Nuclear Physics (DNP) and is currently the chair of the DNP Public Information Committee and the Congressional Reception Committee. She has served as chair of the APS Committee on the Status of Women in Physics and is currently serving on the APS Committee on Minorities. She has served on numerous National Science Foundation (NSF) and Department of Energy (DOE) committees, including the advisory committee for the physics division of the NSF and on the NSF and DOE Nuclear Science Advisory Committee.

Henry Brognard Betts

Doctor of Public Service

enry Brognard Betts, M.D., is chair of the Rehabilitation
Institute of Chicago (RIC)
Foundation and Paul B. Magnuson
Professor in the Department of Physical
Medicine and Rehabilitation at Northwestern University Medical School.

A pioneer in the medical field now known as physiatry (physical medicine and rehabilitation), Dr. Betts served as president and CEO of the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago until 1997. The New York native received his bachelor's degree from Princeton University in 1950 and his M.D. from the University of Virginia in 1954. Following further medical training in rehabilitation medicine at the University of Cincinnati and New York University, he began his medical career at RIC, where he served in virtually every position of leadership from 1963 to 1999.

Under Dr. Betts' leadership, the institute grew from a small hospital to a 20-story facility with multiple con-

tinuum-of-care sites throughout the Chicago area and southern Illinois, providing a full range of inpatient, outpatient, day treatment, and subacute services for thousands of children and adults daily. It has been the most highly ranked rehabilitation hospital in the nation for nine consecutive years in U.S. News and World Report.

Dr. Betts has served on numerous national and international boards to promote not only physiatry and rehabilitation medicine but also to prevent disabilities. His professional service has included membership on the board of the American Association of People with Disabilities, the executive board of the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities, the Stop America's Violence Everywhere (SAVE) Advisory Council, special emissary to the World Committee on Disability, and chair of the board of Physicians Against Land Mines.

Dr. Betts is a past president of the

American Congress of Rehabilitation Medicine (ACRM) and the Association of Academic Physiatrists. He has received numerous awards, including ACRM's Coulter Leadership Award and the Gold Key Award, the Milton Cohen Distinguished Career Award of the National Association of Rehabilitation Facilities, the Henry H. Kessler Human Dignity Award, the Rush Institute for Rehabilitation Medicine Medallion of Honor, and the Distinguished Service Award of the Marine Scholarship Foundation Chicago Chapter.

Dr. Betts' efforts on behalf of people with disabilities have helped remove both attitudinal and physical barriers to their success. He served as a strong advocate for seat belt and drunken driving laws and for the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. He also established a full-time Injury Prevention Program at RIC, aimed at lessening the incidence of preventable injuries.

Betty Frank Schoenbaum

Doctor of Business

President and trustee of the Schoenbaum Family Foundation, Inc., has long been a strong supporter of community and educational causes throughout the world.

The Schoenbaum Family Foundation was established in 1988 by Mrs. Schoenbaum and her late husband, Alex, founder and past chair of Shoney's family restaurant chain, and annually grants funds to numerous charitable and civic organizations, primarily in West Virginia.

The generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Schoenbaum has enhanced the lives of countless individuals and institutions. Among the beneficiaries are civic projects in Charleston and Huntington, West Virginia; the Schoenbaum Human Services Center and Temple Beth Shalom in Sarasota; the Salvation

Army Territorial Development Fund; Schoenbaum Hall administration building at Kiski Prep School in Saltsburg, Pennsylvania; and The Shoney's Foundation, which gives scholarships to children of Shoney's employees.

Since her husband's death in December 1996, Mrs. Schoenbaum has continued the family's philanthropy. She has established a human services center in Charleston, West Virginia, to house nonprofit social services agencies, as well as six charitable trusts that will benefit 22 different charities in Sarasota, Florida; Charleston, West Virginia; and, at Ohio State, the Critical Difference for Women Program of which she was a founding committee member.

An alumna of Ohio State's College of Commerce (now the Fisher College

of Business), Mrs. Schoenbaum has helped fund Schoenbaum Hall, the new undergraduate building on the Fisher College campus. She has also supported scholarships in the Colleges of Business and Education and the Department of Athletics.

Mrs. Schoenbaum has held positions on the boards of The Ohio State University Foundation, the American Jewish Committee, the Florida West Coast Symphony, the Jewish Community Foundation, the Sarasota County Educational Assistance Program, the Women's Resource Center of Sarasota County, Blue Galexy of Sarasota, Boulevard Recreation Corporation, and Boulevard Realty Company. She is currently serving as honorary chair of Sarasota Women's Initiative for United Way of Sarasota County.

Ratan N. Tata

Doctor of Business Administration

atan N. Tata is chair of Tata
Sons Ltd., the lead holding
Company of the 130-year-old
Tata Group, India's largest industrial
and technological conglomerate. He
also serves as chair of a number of the
Tata Group's companies, including
Tata Industries, Tata Engineering and
Locomotive Company, Tata Chemicals,
Information Technology Park, Tata Tea,
and Tata Power Company, as well as
Tata companies in Singapore, London,
New York, and Switzerland.

Born in Mumbai, India, Mr. Tata received a bachelor of science degree in architecture and structural engineering from Cornell University in 1962. He also completed the Advanced Management Program at Harvard University's Graduate School of Business Administration in 1974-75. He joined the Tata Group in 1962 and was assigned to

various companies before being appointed director-in-charge of the National Radio and Electronics Company in 1971. He was named chair of Tata Industries in 1981, where he was responsible for transforming the company into a group strategy thinktank and promoting new ventures in high-technology businesses.

Mr. Tata has played a leading role in India's entry into the fields of informational technology and communications. Tata Consultancy Services is India's largest information technology company, India's top software and services exporter, and the sixth fastest growing consulting company in the world. Mr. Tata also oversaw the creation of the Indica, India's first indigenously designed and developed passenger car, launched in 1998 by Tata Engineering.

Besides his professional responsibili-

ties, Mr. Tata also serves as the chair of two of the largest private sector philanthropic organizations in India, supporting numerous socially relevant initiatives in environmental protection, education, disease prevention, and population planning.

In India, Mr. Tata serves on the central board of the Reserve Bank of India and the Prime Minister's Council on Trade and Industry and is president of the Court of the Indian Institute of Science. His foreign affiliations include membership on the international advisory boards of the Chase Manhattan Corp., Booz-Allen and Hamilton Inc., and the American International Group. In 2000, the government of India recognized him as India's most respected industrialist with one of its highest civilian honors, the Padma Bhushan.

Hiroyuki Yoshino

Doctor of Engineering

iroyuki Yoshino became the fifth president of Honda Motor Co., Ltd., in 1998. During a more-than-37-year career with Honda, Mr. Yoshino has served as president of Honda R&D Co., Ltd., Honda's independent research and development subsidiary; president of Honda of America Manufacturing Inc., in Marysville, Ohio; and chief operating officer of Automobile Operations, including sales, in Japan.

Educated as an aeronautical engineer at Tokyo University, Mr. Yoshino joined Honda in 1963 in research and development. In 1969, he was assigned to a team of engineers working to develop an engine capable of meeting the standards of the U.S. Clean Air Act. These efforts resulted in the breakthrough CVCC (Compound Vortex Combustion Controlled) engine that

helped the Civic become the first automobile to meet the Clean Air Act standards without a catalytic converter.

In the early 1970s, Mr. Yoshino spent more than a year in the United States as the first Honda R&D engineer stationed full time in America, meeting with other major automakers to discuss clean air requirements. In 1981, he became general manager of the Asaka R&D Center for the development of new motorcycles, and, in 1983, he was elected director of Honda Motor Co. and named president of Honda Racing Corporation. He moved to the manufacturing side in 1987, becoming general manager of Honda's Suzuka factory.

In June 1988, he was named president of Honda of America Manufacturing in Ohio. During his four-year tenure in Ohio, Mr. Yoshino guided Honda's continued growth of Ohio manufactur-

ing operations with the \$450 million expansion of the Anna Engine Plant and the start-up of the \$380 million East Liberty Auto Plant. He oversaw the growth of exports from Ohio, and, in 1990, the Marysville Auto Plant became the first auto plant in the United States to build both right- and left-hand-drive cars on the same production line.

In 1992, Mr. Yoshino returned to Japan as executive vice president and representative director of Honda Motor Co. to work toward rejuvenating Japan's auto sales. He became president of Honda R&D in 1994, overseeing the introduction of a series of new products and a strong commitment to environmental leadership. In 1998, he was honored with the Distinguished Service Citation from the Automotive Hall of Fame for leading Honda's environmental technology achievements.

Daniel G. Amstutz

Distinguished Service Award

aniel G. Amstutz is president of Amstutz & Company, a Washington, D.C.-based consulting practice, which he started following his retirement from the North American Export Grain Association, where he served as president and CEO from 1995 to 2000. He is also chair of a start-up e-commerce company, Pradium, Inc., that is developing an online global cash grain and oilseed market.

Previously, Mr. Amstutz was executive director for four years of the International Wheat Council in London, England. While there, he spearheaded the negotiations leading to the creation of its successor organization, the International Grains Council, which provides a foundation for this intergovernmental organization to function in the 21st century.

Mr. Amstutz received his bachelor's

degree in business administration in 1954 from Ohio State. During his student years, he served as both president and secretary of the Student Senate and was on the Council of Student Affairs and Fraternity Presidents.

Following his graduation, he joined Cargill, Inc., where he served in a number of management and grain merchandising roles for the next 25 years. He founded and was president and CEO of Cargill Investor Services and, as a general partner of Goldman, Sachs and Company, directed that firm's commodity activities.

In 1983, Mr. Amstutz accepted an appointment by President Reagan as Undersecretary of Agriculture for International Affairs and Commodity Programs and then, in 1987, as Ambasador and Special Envoy for Agricultural Trade and Development with the

Agency for International Development, where he became the leading negotiator for the agricultural aspects of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) talks.

Today, Mr. Amstutz serves as an advisor to the U.S. government as a member of the Agriculture Policy Advisory Committee (APAC) and as a member of the Agribusiness Committee of the U.S./Russia Commission.

Throughout his career, he has been supportive of Ohio State, providing leadership, counsel, and resources. He has established endowed scholarships in the names of his parents, both Ohio State graduates. He is a lifetime member of the Presidents Club and the Alumni Association, where he served on the board of directors from 1985 to 1990 and as co-chair of the campaign for Alumni House.

Ben E. Espy

Distinguished Service Award

District, was Senate minority leader from 1996 to 2000. He is currently the ranking minority member of the Senate Judiciary Committee and a member of the Energy, Natural Resources, and Environment Committee. A member of the Senate since 1992, he also serves on several special committees, including the Greater Hilltop State Lands and Facilities Commission, the Ohio Ballot Board, the Commission on African American Males, the Appellant District Study Committee, and the State Criminal Sentencing Commission.


Senator Espy earned his bachelor of arts degree in political science at The Ohio State University in 1965 and a juris doctorate at Howard University School of Law in 1968. While at Ohio State, he was a member of the football and track teams and was involved with the Air Force ROTC, the Civil Rights Commission, and Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity.

Following service in the U.S. Air Force as an assistant staff judge advocate, Senator Espy joined Ohio's Office of the Attorney General in 1972, first as deputy chief in the Civil Rights Division, then as chief of the Division of Criminal Activities. He started his own law practice in 1977 and, from 1982 to 1992, served on the Columbus City Council. During that time he founded the Columbus Youth Corps, a summer employment and job readiness program for inner-city youth that was named a "point of light" by President George Bush. He also created "The Job Show," an award-winning cable television program to help people find employment.

Senator Espy has long been an advocate for the university in the state legislature. He served as Ohio State's representative to the Big Ten Advisory Commission, providing counsel to the Big Ten on issues facing current and former student athletes. He currently is serving on the board of directors of the Alumni Association and has been an active participant in the Alumni Association Advocates program as speaker and member.

Strongly committed to his community, Senator Espy is a member of the Catholic Diocese Foundation Advisory Board, the Urban Christian Leadership Association, the board of trustees of the I-670 Development Commission, Inroads Inc., and Merry Makers of Columbus.







THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

he colorful ceremonies of The Ohio State University commencements derive from practices originating in the Middle Ages. When European universities were taking form in the 12th and 13th centuries, the scholars were usually clerics, and consequently they adopted costumes similar to those of their monastic orders. Cold halls and drafty buildings called for caps and floor-length capes with attached hoods, and the sobering influence of the church probably influenced the staid character of the caps and gowns.

As the control of the universities gradually passed from the church, some

aspects of the costumes took on brighter hues. Old prints and engravings, however, reveal a strong similarity between the regalia worn in early universities and that of the present day.

In light of our nation's English heritage, academic costume has been in use in the United States since colonial times. To establish a standard of uniformity in regard to the practice, an intercollegiate commission was formed to prepare a code for caps, gowns, and hoods that has since been adopted by all academic institutions.

Originally round, the shape of the cap is now the familiar mortarboard

square-a shape which, according to ballad folklore, resembles a scholar's book. Legend also has it that the privilege of wearing a cap was the initial right of a freed Roman slave; the academic cap, therefore, has become a sign of the freedom of scholarship. The flowing gown has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any dress that might indicate rank or social status. The hood, reserved at The Ohio State University for those receiving doctoral degrees, not only indicates the type of degree, but also is lined with the official colors of the university.

The Gown

Bachelor: Black, full cut with long pointed sleeves. **Master:** Black, long or short sleeves with arc-shaped panel extended for each sleeve.

Doctor: Black with velvet panels on front of gown and three velvet bars on each sleeve. Color of the velvet may be black or distinctive of the field of study.

Honors Emblem

The Ohio State University honors emblem is a scarlet and gray tasseled braid worn over the gown. Students eligible for this curricular honor are those graduating *summa cum laude*, *magna cum laude*, *cum laude*, with distinction, with honors in business, with honors in the liberal arts, and with honors in pharmacy.

The Hood

Bachelor: Three feet long with a two-inch-wide velvet edging.* **Master:** Three and one-half feet long with a three-inch-wide velvet edging.*

Doctor: Four feet in length with a five-inch-wide velvet edging and panel at the sides.

The lining of all hoods, which is folded out, bears the official colors of the institution granting the degree. The color of the velvet indicates the field of study:

Dentistry	Lilac
Law	Purple
Medicine	Green




Cap and Tassel




